Attendance from the start of the Autumn Term



Please remember school starts at 8.45am and ensure that your child is ready to line up on the playground or enter their door for this time. If you child arrives after this time but before 9.00am please knock on their classroom door. Doors may be closed because of weather and as

safeguarding procedure. After 9.00am, please report to the school office.

Holidays in Term Time, Don't forget the school does not authorise holidays in school time and we do fine parents for taking children out of school unless there are unavoidable, extreme circumstances when the school may authorise this.

The school office must be notified if your child is ill or unable to attend due to a medical appointment or other unavoidable reason. Absences can be reported by calling 01442 404008, using Option 1 and leaving a message. If your child is absent without notification you will be contacted by telephone and asked to provide a reason for the absence.



Medical Appointments - We request that, where possible, routine medical and dentist appointments are arranged outside school hours as these appointments will affect your child's percentage attendance. We do understand that some appointments, such as hospital consultations, are not always possible to arrange outside of school hours. However, if your child's appointment time allows your child to come to school for registration and then leave this will have a positive impact on their attendance figure. This also applies if they are able to be back in school for afternoon registration.

Congratulations to Maple, this week's winner of our attendance cup with a very impressive 100% attendance. They were closely followed by Willow and Redwood who tied for second place with 99.3%, with Sycamore in third with 98.7%. Overall our weekly attendance for the whole school was 96.2% which is slightly above the Government recommended target of 96%. Well done everyone.
