SAFEGUARDING UPDATE - ON-LINE SAFETY TIKTOK

TikTok is a popular app. Your child must be over 13 years old to use TikTok.



As with all internet platforms, there are pros and cons to their use;

What should parents be concerned about?

When you download the app users can see all the content without creating an account although they are not able to post, like, or share anything until they've set up an account on the app.

By default, all accounts are public so anyone on the app can see what your child shares. However, only approved followers can send messages to them.

Users can like or react to a video, follow an account or send messages to each other. There is the risk that strangers will be able to contact your child on the app.

Children may be tempted to take risks to get more of a following or likes on a video, so, it is important to talk about what they share and with who.





Does TikTok have any safety features?

Like Facebook and Instagram, it has a <u>digital wellbeing element</u> (which is password protected) which alerts users who have been on the app for more than 2 hours. You can also turn on 'restricted mode' to filter out inappropriate content on the app.

Set your account to private

You can set an account to be private so that all videos can only be seen by the creator and no one else on the platform. With a private account, you can approve or deny users and limit incoming messages to followers only.

Please note that even with a private account, your child's profile photo, username, and bio are still visible to all users on the platform. You can manage who can comment, duet and direct message your child on the app.

Family Safety Mode links a parent's TikTok account to their child's and once enabled, they will be able to control Digital Wellbeing features, including:

Screen Time Management: Control how long their teen can spend on TikTok each day.

Direct Messages: Limit who can send messages to the connected account or turn off direct messaging completely.

Restricted Mode: Restrict the appearance of content that may not be appropriate for all audiences

How to report inappropriate content on the TikTok app?

You can report content that doesn't follow TikTok's <u>community guidelines</u> within the app. https://support.tiktok.com/en/safety-hc/report-a-problem
