Rule of Law	Learning and discussing the fundamental aspects of different religions eg 10 Commandments, 5 Pillars of Islam	Children are encouraged to think about the laws, commandments, and expectations within a faith and how those rules would impact on their own lives as well as on the lives of the people within those religions. Children are encouraged to understand the origins of the various codes of conduct, rules, laws and expectations put forward by different religions, and to consider their own position in relation to these.
Individual Liberty	Promote the idea that individuals have freedom to choose what they believe and that not everyone within a faith will practise it in the same way. Mutual Respect for and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs	Teach and promote understanding of different faiths, beliefs and traditions. Celebrating and participating in festivals. Experience diversity and within the wider community through visits within the community and to school.	Through learning about faith practices and really investigating what they mean for the individuals, children are encouraged to develop mutual respect and tolerance but also to develop critical thinking skills enabling them to question and discuss beliefs
